## SAM2 Risk Assessment and Management Policy

### **Background:**

The Parish Council purchased a SAM2 Speed Activation sign in December 2022. The project is managed by the parish council through volunteers (including councillors) in the community. This risk assessment covers the management of the SAM2 sign.

The parish council will advise volunteers the sites of the posts for the SAM2. These sites have been agreed with Norfolk County Council Highways and are currently agreed as various existing posts on Norwich Road, Strumpshaw within the 30-mph limit as discussed on a site visit on 3 August 2022.

It is a requirement that the SAM2 is moved every 4 weeks between the posts and not to return within 8 weeks. A log should be kept of the places and dates the SAM2 is installed. Data downloads from the SAM2 unit should be emailed to the Clerk for circulation to councillors and publication on the Parish Council website.

#### Risks involved and minimising those risks:

Moving the SAM2 is heavy and takes place adjacent to the highway. Volunteers are advised to work in pairs and should wear Hi-Viz waistcoats or jackets, as provided by the parish council when undertaking this work. A lead volunteer will be identified. They will show new volunteers how to handle the SAM2.

## Other things which can be done to minimise risk:

The council will receive regular reports from the volunteers about any potential dangers experienced by the volunteers and will aim to minimise those risks.
